Hollis Moore explained the Texas Academic Performance Report (TAPR) is a process rating the district and each campus. He gave an overview of the ratings received by the district and each campus in the different areas of performance. The report will be posted on the district website.

Campus

High School

Rusty Baldwin, Principal, reported enrollment stands at 378 students with 20 of those students being out of district transfers. Attendance is at 96.3%. Forty students passed the food handler certification. Homecoming ran smoothly but looking for ways to improve it for next year. UIL Academics have begun with 100 plus students attending the initial meeting. Juniors will be ordering their senior rings. Special Olympics will be traveling to Centennial Park in Abilene for competition. Regional band marching contest will be in October at Leander.

Middle School

Shona Moore, Principal, reported the first pep rally went very well. Attendance has been an issue. Sexting awareness information will be given to the students. Progress reports have gone out. Incentives for participating and doing well in UIL Academics have been given to the students. Student Council elections are coming soon. Continue looking at areas that need improvement for the success of student standardized testing.

Brady Elementary

Angela Bierman, Principal, stated there is an enrollment of 590 students. The first PTO/SHAC/Title I combined meetings was held at Richard's Park with a very good turnout. The first meeting for the Grade 5 Science Camp was held to discuss fund raisers. Parent conferences will be Oct. 7. Book Fair will be Oct. 10-14 with Family Night being on the 10th. UIL sign-ups were last week.

Athletics

Chuck Lipsey, Athletic Director, went over the results of the previous MS and HS football games as well as the Cross Country meets. He listed the football player injuries. District Cross Country will be in Coleman on October 17.

Food Service

Sheri Wheeler, Director, complimented the employees for their food presentation and they are all working well together. Thirty plus parents have signed up for SHAC. She would like to get local farmers involved in teaching students proper nutrition and food growing. Grandparents lunch will be on October 14. She explained a parent/child cooking team competition is available with prizes going to the team winners as well as the campus the student attends.
